Student Code of Conduct

Our Lady of Good Counsel School's Student Code of Conduct allows children to develop as Christian people in a safe, caring and supportive environment. It seeks to encourage behaviours centered on gospel values, while at the same time developing an awareness of the expectations. Through the implementation of this 'Student Code of Conduct', we are attempting to create a happy and safe school environment where all students can learn to their potential.

At Our Lady of Good Counsel School we want to feel included.

1. In order to feel included we will let others to play our games. When someone isn't feeling included, or there is conflict, we will invite them to play with us.
2. In order to feel included we will let all know that anyone can join in. When someone isn't feeling included or there is conflict, we will ensure we are being clear about letting all play.
3. In order to feel included we will stand up for our friends. When someone isn't feeling included, or there is conflict, we will stand up for our friends
4. In order to feel included we will use positive body language and facial expressions. When someone isn't feeling included, or there is conflict, we will make eye contact, use pleasant facial expressions and open social circles to others.

At Our Lady of Good Counsel School we want to feel enthusiastic.

1. In order to feel enthusiastic, we will be positive even though we may not feel confident. When someone isn't feeling enthusiastic, or there is conflict, we will assure them they will be alright and can talk to you when they need someone.
2. In order to feel enthusiastic, we will do our best. When someone isn't feeling enthusiastic, or there is conflict, we will lead by example by displaying positive self-talk and work behaviours.
3. In order to feel enthusiastic we will complete our work. When someone isn't feeling enthusiastic, or there is conflict, we will ask if they need any help and encourage them to 'give it a go' and try their best.
4. In order to feel enthusiastic, we will use one of the eight strategies for resilience. When someone isn't feeling enthusiastic, or there is conflict, we will remind them to use resilience strategies (take a break, talk to someone, do something fun, keep perspective, walk away, be assertive)

At Our Lady of Good Counsel School we want to feel capable.

1. In order to feel capable we will believe in each other and ourselves. When someone isn't feeling capable, or there is conflict, we will encourage and help them to do their best.
2. In order to feel capable we will believe in who we are. When someone isn't feeling capable, or there is conflict, we will have to stand up to those who are tearing us down.
3. In order to feel capable we will encourage ourselves and others. When someone isn't feeling capable, or there is conflict, we will tell them they can do it.
4. In order to feel capable we will have a good relationship with our teacher. When someone isn't feeling capable, or there is conflict, we will display good manners, show reflective behaviours and communicate with our teachers.

At Our Lady of Good Counsel School we want to feel comfortable

1. In order to feel comfortable we will have strong friendship bonds. When someone isn't feeling comfortable, or there is conflict, we will let others come to us and build their trust.
2. In order to feel comfortable we will make others feel safe. When someone isn't feeling comfortable, or there is conflict, we will talk to them in a kind way.
3. In order to feel comfortable we will conduct safe behaviours in the classroom and on the playground. When someone isn't feeling comfortable, or there is conflict, we will stop the unsafe behaviours or seek help from a teacher.

1. In order to feel pride, we will be confident in all we do. When someone isn't feeling pride, or there is conflict, we will compliment them truthfully.
2. In order to feel pride, we will keep our head held high. When someone isn't feeling pride, or there is conflict, we will tell them to "give it a go".
3. In order to feel pride, we will value people's opinions and show interest in the person's life. When someone isn't feeling pride, or there is conflict, we will motivate and support them by showing an interest in what they have to say.
